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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

For the month of August, the FBMKLCI Index closed marginally lower by 0.5% MoM to 1,451.94 points. This has widened the YTD loss to -2.9%. The flat monthly performance was due to lack of catalyst. The average daily trading value in the month rose 11.6% MoM and 24.7% YoY to RM2.2bil. Meanwhile, average daily trading volume in rose 11.8% MoM and 43.3% YoY to 3.5bil units.

Malaysia Government Securities ("MGS") yields were seen steepening, indicating the strong buying interest in the shorter-end of curve. Brent crude oil prices continued to rally to USD86.86/barrel (end-Jul'23: USD85.56/barrel), supported by the OPEC+ production cuts. Meanwhile, ringgit weakened against the dollar to MYR4.6385/USD (end-Jul'23: MYR4.5070/USD) following the robust economic data in US.

On the local economic data, Malaysia GDP growth decelerated to +2.9% YoY in 2Q'23 (1Q'23: +5.6% YoY), given the low base effect from the economic re-opening in Apr'22.

For the equity market, after series of interest rate hikes by the US Federal Reserve to fight against inflation in the 1H2023, the economy has proven to be more resilient than anticipated. We are more optimistic about the outlook for economic expansion this year. Locally, post OPR rate hike to 3.00% in May 2023, we expect BNM to maintain the OPR unchanged for the remaining of 2023. The OPR rate hike will be negatively impact to the local equity market for short term period. However, for longer term, we expect there will be recovery in the 2H2023 when the inflation started to inch lower. Historical analysis is suggesting that lower interest rates due to lower inflation will be positive for the equity market.

Meanwhile for fixed income, after a series of recent OPR hikes to pre-pandemic level, BNM is anticipated to keep its monetary policy unchanged in 2H2023, aiming to balance the economic growth and inflationary pressure in the country. The external risk factors such as Russia-Ukraine geopolitical tension and the fluctuation in crude oil prices will continue to weigh on the local market, but we believe corporate bond space still provides attractive yields. As such, our fixed income strategy will remain defensive to shelter from the market volatilities in the near term.

Based on the table below, on a monthly basis, Asiapac Fund, Global Yakin Fund, Income Fund and Titan Fund managed to outperform the benchmarks.

Policyholders are encouraged to focus on regular premiums given the current risk and volatile period of the economic and market condition. Risk-averse investors should focus on income funds due to its less volatile as compared to equity-related funds.

Investment Objective

To achieve a steady income stream with potential growth in the Asia Pacific Region over the medium to long term. The aim of the Fund is to outperform the S&P Ethical Pan Asia Select Dividend Opportunities Index over periods of five or more years.

Investment Strategy

To invest in Principal S&P Asia Pacific Ethical Dividend Exchange Traded Fund (ETF), managed by Principal Asset Management (S) Pte Ltd where the ETF is listed on the Singapore Stock Exchange.

The ETF focuses on the top 40 ethical and high-yielding stocks in the Asia Pacific Region excluding India, Taiwan, Japan, New Zealand, and the Philippines. The fund provides country diversification across the industry that is traded in US Dollars.

Risk is managed at the management level, where the asset allocation of the fund is to be reviewed on a regular basis and adjusted to be commensurate with the Investment Team's view on the relative attractiveness of each asset class.







Investment Objective

The Fund invests in MyETF Dow Jones U.S. Titans 50 ("MyETF-US50") which aims to provide investment results that closely correspond to the performance of the Dow Jones Islamic Market U.S. Titans 50 Index. The Fund is not a Shariah-compliant product.

Investment Strategy

MyETFDJ50 is managed by i-VCAP Management Sdn Bhd and it invests in 50 largest Shariah-compliant companies listed in the U.S. MyETFDJ50 is a passively managed fund.

Risks

The Fund is considered low risk given the exposure to only one underlying securities with no attempt to select stocks individually or to take defensive positions in declining markets. Risk is managed at the management level, where the asset allocation of the fund is to be reviewed on a regular basis and adjusted to be commensurate with the Investment Team's view on the relative attractiveness of each asset class.




Equity Market Review and Outlook

Market Review

For the month of August, the FBMKLCI Index closed marginally lower by 0.5% MoM to 1,451.94 points. This has widened the YTD loss to -2.9%. The flat monthly performance was due to lack of catalyst. The average daily trading value in the month rose 11.6% MoM and 24.7% YoY to RM2.2bil. Meanwhile, average daily trading volume in rose 11.8% MoM and 43.3% YoY to 3.5bil units.

Foreign investors stayed net buyers in August for the second consecutive month, having previously been net selling Malaysia equities for ten consecutive months. However, their net buy flow was lower MoM at MYR0.1bil compared to MYR1.4bil in July 23. Meanwhile, local institutional investors turned net buyers at MYR432.1mil, compared to net sell flow of MYR762.6mil in July. Local retailers stayed net sellers in August which net sell flow decrease 22% to RM 431.7mil compared to MYR556.1mil in July.

Meanwhile, global equity markets rally took a breather in August as investor became more cautious on the economic data that may force the Federal Reserve to raise interest rate hike by end of the year. Dow Jones Industrial Index closed lower by 2.4% MoM and the broader S&P 500 index closed lower by 1.8% MoM. Eurozone shares also posted loss as worries about slowing global growth dented risk appetite, where Bloomberg European 500 index closed -2.6% MoM. In Asia, the performances were mostly negative as Chinese stocks experienced sharp declines in August, with the country's property sector performing particularly poorly as investors doubt that Beijing will deliver enough stimulus to put the world's second-largest economy back on track. MSCI Asia APEX 50 ex-Japan closed -7.2% MoM during the month.



Market Outlook & Strategy

Traditionally, FBMKLCI index's performance tends to be negative in September, with average -1.0% and -1.7% MoM returns over the past 10 years and 45 years respectively. However, we expect the market to be supportive by its attractive valuations at current levels of 1.31x as it is now below its 13-year historical average of P/B (1.90x) and 15.8x PER compared to the 13-year historical average of PER (17.2x).

Technically, the FBMKLCI index has witnessed a bullish MACD crossover recently and surpassed the 50-day SMA. If the index were to move above the previous high of 1,500 level, there is a potential case for more bullishness, but as it stands the bullish crossover likely only means a rally to the top of the channel. We expect the index to gain further grounds towards 1,500 levels, supported by bottoming-up indicators. Meanwhile, key support is pegged at 1,400 levels.

After series of interest rate hikes by the US Federal Reserve to fight against inflation in the 1H2023, the economy has proven to be more resilient than anticipated. We are more optimistic about the outlook for economic expansion this year. Locally, post OPR rate hike to 3.00% in May 2023, we expect BNM to maintain the OPR unchanged for the remaining of 2023. The OPR rate hike will be negatively impact to the local equity market for short term period. However, for longer term, we expect there will be recovery in the 2H2023 when the inflation started to inch lower. Historical analysis is suggesting that lower interest rates due to lower inflation will be positive for the equity market.

Fixed Income Review and Outlook

Market Review

Malaysia Government Securities ("MGS") yields were seen steepening, indicating the strong buying interest in the shorter-end of curve. Brent crude oil prices continued to rally to USD86.86/barrel (end-Jul'23: USD85.56/barrel), supported by the OPEC+ production cuts. Meanwhile, ringgit weakened against the dollar to MYR4.6385/USD (end-Jul'23: MYR4.5070/USD) following the robust economic data in US.


On the local economic data, Malaysia GDP growth decelerated to +2.9% YoY in 2Q'23 (1Q'23: +5.6% YoY), given the high base effect from the economic re-opening in Apr'22. Domestic Demand was remained unchanged, but the External Demand was pivoted into decline to -3.7% YoY in 2Q'23 (1Q'23: +54.4% YoY) due to the weak volume in both Exports and Imports of goods and services. Headline inflation continued to record lower to +2.0% YoY in Jul'23, mainly driven by the persistent moderation in Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (FNAB) in line with the easing of global food price inflation. Malaysia's Exports and Imports continued to shrink by -13.1% YoY and -15.9% YoY respectively in Jul'23. All major Export segments declined in Jul'23, due to the weaker global economic conditions. Contraction in Imports was also driven by all segments, except for Capital Goods which rebounded to +5.9% YoY (Jun'23: -11.9% YoY). In summary, trade surplus tightened to +MYR17.1n in Jul'23 as compared to +MYR25.5b a month earlier.


BNM's international reserve rose slightly to USD112.2b as at mid-Aug'23 (mid-Jul'23: USD111.8b). The reserve is sufficient to finance 5.2 months of retained imports and is 1.0 times of short-term external debts.

The 10-year US Treasury yield rose to a 16-year high at 4.34% before easing back to 4.11% as at end-Aug'23 (end-Jul'23: 3.96%). This yield movement was taking the mixed view between robust economic data and upside inflationary risk.

Market Outlook & Strategy

After a series of recent OPR hikes to pre-pandemic level, BNM is anticipated to keep its monetary policy unchanged in 2H2023, aiming to balance the economic growth and inflationary pressure in the country. The external risk factors such as Russia-Ukraine geopolitical tension will continue to weigh on the local market, but we believe corporate bond space still provides attractive yields. As such, our fixed income strategy will remain defensive to shelter from the market volatilities in the near term.
