

Investment Link Fund Performance Report August 2020

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The winning streak of FBMKLCI Index in the past four months came to a halt in August as profit-taking activities took place. The benchmark index closed lower by -4.9% to 1,525.21 points during the month, dragged by glove stock, Hartalega (-18.5% MoM) and banking sector (-4% MoM). It was also partly due to concerns over weaker-than-expected 2Q20 GDP as well as softer-than-expected earnings registered by corporates hit by the MCO during the 2Q20 results season. The benchmark index had underperformed the FBM EMAS Index, which posted narrower losses of -2.9% MoM to close at 11,085.58 points.

Meanwhile, on the fixed income market, Malaysia Government Securities ("MGS") yield curve steepened in August'20 on the back of weaker-than-expected 2Q2020 GDP growth as well as the worries of increasing the national debt ceiling from 55% to 60% of GDP. Brent crude oil prices rose higher to USD45.28/barrel compared to a month earlier at USD43.30/barrel, supported by the global economic recovery data.

On local economic data, Malaysia's 2Q2020 GDP growth fell by -17.1% YoY (market expectation: -10.9% YoY), making the biggest drop since the Asian Financial Crisis 1997-98 at -11.2% YoY. Sharp contraction was seen across all key sectors, except Agriculture sector. This is due to the full impact arising from the enforcement of Movement Control Order (MCO), which is to combat the COVID-19 pandemic.

Moving forward, we continue to remain cautious on the equity market. Concerns over the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic in Malaysia and globally, we expect the FBMKLCI to remain volatile. We will be selective on the stock picking, weighting on the defensive stocks amid uncertainty.

For fixed income, following the OPR cut by 120bps and SRR cut by 100bps in this year, BNM is expected to stay dovish monetary stance for the remaining of 2020, in line with the weaker economic prospect arising from the COVID-19 outbreak globally. The external risk factors such as new cold war between US and China and the fluctuation in crude oil prices will continue to weigh on the local market, but we believe corporate bond space still provides attractive yields. As such, we will keep looking to buy on dips of corporate bonds if the opportunity arises.

Based on table below, on monthly basis, the performances were mixed with IL-Balanced, IL-Dividend, IL-Equity and IL-Income funds outperformed the benchmarks.

Policyholders are encouraged to focus into regular premium given the current risk and volatile period of the economic and market condition. Risk adverse investors should focus into income fund due to its less volatile as compared to equity related funds.

Investment Objective





The Fund invests in MyETF Dow Jones U.S. Titans 50 ("MyETFDJ50") which aims to provide investment results that closely correspond to the performance of the Dow Jones Islamic Market U.S. Titans 50 Index.

Investment Strategy

MyETFDJ50 is managed by i-VCAP Management Sdn Bhd and it invests into 50 largest Shariah compliant companies listed in the U.S. MyETFDJ50 is a passively managed fund.

Risks

The Fund is considered low risk given the exposure to only one underlying securities with no attempt to select stocks individually or to take defensive positions in declining markets. Risk is managed at the management level, where the asset allocation of the fund to be reviewed on regular basis, and adjusted to commensurate with the Investment Team view on the relative attractiveness of each asset class.




Equity Market Review and Outlook

Market Review

The winning streak of FBMKLCI Index in the past four months came to a halt in August as profit-taking activities took place. The benchmark index closed lower by -4.9% to 1,525.21 points during the month, dragged by glove stock, Hartalega (-18.5% MoM) and banking sector (-4% MoM). It was also partly due to concerns over weaker-than-expected 2Q20 GDP as well as softer-than-expected earnings registered by corporates hit by the MCO during the 2Q20 results season. The benchmark index had underperformed the FBM EMAS Index, which posted narrower losses of -2.9% MoM to close at 11,085.58 points.

The average daily value traded on the Malaysian equity market improved 31% m-o-m to RM7.2bil during the month, supported by strong interest from retail participants. This is significantly higher than the average daily trading value of RM2.15 bil achieved in 2019. In August, foreign investors sold RM1.37bil worth of Malaysian equities, -46% lower than last month. This brought the net foreign outflow to RM20.2bil for the first 8 month of the year 2020, which is 84% higher than the RM11bil outflow registered in 2019. As a result, the cumulative net foreign fund outflows from Malaysia in the equity market (since 2010) expanded to RM29.1bil.

Globally, the US equity markets continued its positive momentum for the month of August, led by healthcare and information technology sectors. August marked the end of the second-quarter earnings seasons, and over 84% of companies had beat the expectations. Furthermore, decreasing number of Covid-19 cases in August has strengthened the sentiment. Dow Jones and S&P 500 gained 8.4% and 7.2% MoM respectively. Meanwhile, Bloomberg European 500 index and MSCI Asia APEX 50 ex-Japan closed positively by 3.4% MoM and 6.7% MoM respectively.



Market Outlook & Strategy

Technically, the market fell below its 50-day and 200-day EMAs for the first time since May and June, respectively, in the last trading day in August. The recent failure to take out the previous double top support (turned resistance) band of 1,585-1,620 also signals that a slightly prolonged consolidation may be next. That close also saw the index fell and close below its 21-week EMA for the first time since mid-May, further warning that more weakness may follow in September. The next support is the 1,500 psychological level followed by the 1,476.

Based on historical data, we note that the FBMKLCI's performance tends to be negative in September, having registered an average monthly negative return of -0.6% over the past 10 years. Moving forward, we continue to remain cautious on the equity market. Concerns over the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic in Malaysia and globally, we expect the FBMKLCI to remain volatile. We will be selective on the stock picking, weighting on the defensive stocks amid uncertainty.

Fixed Income Review and Outlook

Market Review

Malaysia Government Securities ("MGS") yield curve steepened in August'20 on the back of weaker-than-expected 2Q2020 GDP growth as well as the worries of increasing the national debt ceiling from 55% to 60% of GDP. Brent crude oil prices rose higher to USD45.28/barrel compared to a month earlier at USD43.30/barrel, supported by the global economy recovery. The Ringgit strengthened against the Dollar to MYR4.1640/USD (Jul'20: MYR4.2393/USD), arising from the sharp weakening in Dollar.

On the local economic data, Malaysia's 2Q2020 GDP growth fell by -17.1% YoY (market expectation: -10.9% YoY), making the biggest drop since the Asian Financial Crisis 1997-98 at -11.2% YoY. Sharp contraction was seen across all key sectors, except Agriculture sector. This is due to the full impact arising from the enforcement of Movement Control Order (MCO), which is to combat the COVID-19 pandemic. Subsequent to the poor GPD figure, BNM downgraded the nation's 2020 full year GDP growth forecast from -2.0%~+0.5% to -3.5%~-5.5%.


Headline inflation continued to moderate at -1.3% YoY in July'20 (June'20: -1.9% YoY) on the back of slower decline in Transport cost arising from the weak global oil price. Malaysia's trade surplus widened further to +MYR25.1bil in July'20 (June'20: +MYR20.9bil) given the imports contracted to -8.7% YoY (June'20: -5.6% YoY) while the exports moderated to +3.1% YoY (June'20: +8.0% YoY).

External reserve continued to trend slightly higher to USD104.4bil as at end-August'20 (end-July'20: USD104.2bil), thanks to the foreign buying into local bond market despite of net selling in local equities. The reserve is sufficient to cover 8.6 months of retained imports and 1.1x short-term external debt, and is 15.5% above the minimum requirement of USD90.2bil IMF Reserve Adequacy.

The 10-year US Treasury ("UST") yield moved 18bps higher to 0.71% as at end-August'20, due to influx of debt supply in August'20. The US Fed also announced that it would allow inflation to pop above the target of 2%, compared to previous policy of pre-emptively raise interest rate before hitting 2%.

Market Outlook & Strategy

Following the OPR cut by 120bps and SRR cut by 100bps in this year, BNM is expected to stay dovish monetary stance for the remaining of 2020, in line with the weaker economic prospect arising from the COVID-19 outbreak globally. The external risk factors such as new cold war between US and China and the fluctuation in crude oil prices will continue to weigh on the local market, but we believe corporate bond space still provides attractive yields. As such, we will keep looking to buy on dips of corporate bonds if the opportunity arises.
