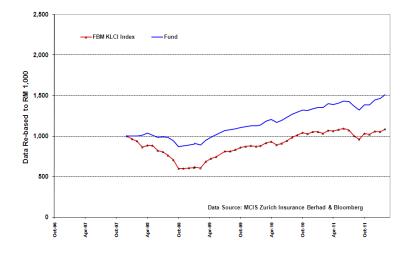

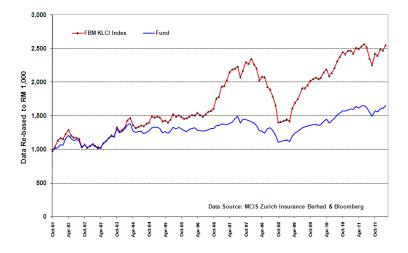

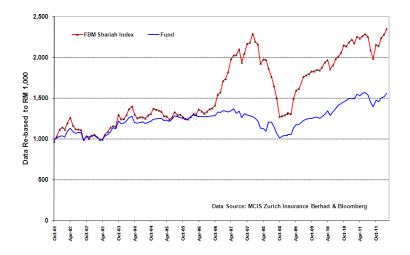

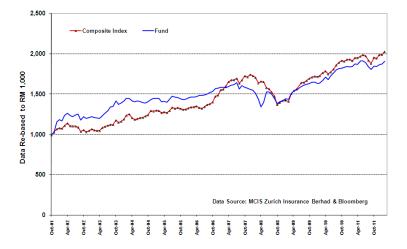

Equity Market Review and Outlook

Market Review

Bursa Malaysia has managed to perform strongly in the month of February 2012, after a sideways trend in the month of January 2012 on the back of interest on the selected blue-chips on the back of better than expected results for the period ending 31 December 2011. Second and lower liners stocks saw continued interest with heavy volume.

For the month FBMKLCI gained 3.2% to close at 1,569.65. As at end of Feb'12, the FBMKLCI is only 1.7% below its all-time high of 1,597.08 which was recorded in July 2011. The broader market lagged the KLCI as the FBM Emas rose 2.6% to 10,862.75.

On the economic front, 4Q'11 GDP confirmed a slow trend in the 4Q'11 with a growth of 5.2% yoy (after reporting 5.8% in 3Q'11), due to weak exports. Although domestic demand acted as a buffer, there was some let-up in the growth of consumer spending and private investment. For the full year 2011, growth was at 5.1% as compared to 7.2% recorded in 2010. On the inflation front, headline inflation moderated further for the third month to 2.7% yoy in Jan'12 on the back of softening economy and receding price pressure for transport and food.

Results released in the month of Feb'12 was not worst than expected as some improvement in certain sectors namely Consumer, Construction and Media have managed to offset the poor performance showed in Automotive, Aviation and Shipping sectors to name a few. However, it is still too early to hope for better results in the coming quarters given the current economic condition which is still showing no signs of a strong recovery.

After the recent strong run-up where the FBMKLCI rose to 1,594.72 on 5 March 2012 to test its all time high of 1597.08 on July 2011, we do not discount a mild correction to occur in the immediate term as a correction phase. Development in the overseas market especially in the Europe and the Wall Street should be

For the immediate term, support is seen at 1,550 and resistance remains at 1,597.08 level. We are cautious on potential correction on the equity market for the immediate term.

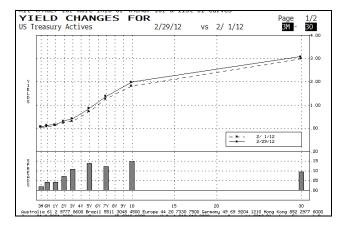
Market Review

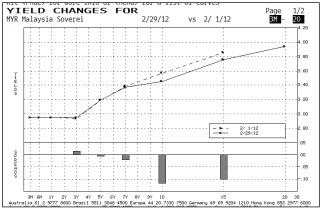
Malaysian Government Bonds closed mixed in February. For the month, short term MGS yields rose whilst longer tenor yields fell. At the same time swap rates edged higher as there were lower expectations of a rate cut in the upcoming Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting slated for 9 March 2012.

Latest hints from Bank Negara Governor that the central bank could potentially be leaving policy rates unchanged during the upcoming MPC meeting contrasted with earlier in the month when there more widespread expectations of a rate cut. In the first MPC meeting this year held in January, policy makers held the Overnight Policy Rate (OPR) steady at 3.00%, but reminded the market even though there was no imminent push for a cut at the time, they will still concentrate on external development which was a major determinant of upcoming policy action. In a highly uncertain Euro zone debt crisis management, the central bank was keeping all options open. Basically, policy makers were hinting that they will act if external developments results in a drag in domestic economic growth.

Although a short month, there were 3 government auctions scheduled in February. It began with the 3.5-year GII 7/15, where the average yield was 3.186% and garnered a bid to cover (btc) of 2.93x. Subsequently, we had the 10.5-year MGS 8/22 where the average yield was 3.418% with a btc of 2.36x. The last government auction for February was 7.5-year GII09/19, which was to be issued end February at an average yield of 3.309% and formed a btc of 2.31x. Overall, demand for government bonds in general remained supported, as reflected in the respective btcs of more than 2x.

US Treasury papers were dealt weaker for the month. Generally, players were net sellers of the safer haven US government securities on news EU finance ministers approved the second bailout package for Greece, to the tune of €130 billion. However, the agreement only came about as Greece lawmakers agreed to sign in another round of austerity measures, including €3.3 billion spending and pension reforms for this year; as is markets remained concerned over Greece's ability to balance debt repayment capabilities against a contracting economy.





Market Outlook & Strategy

We are still of the view that the local economy would face some challenges especially in terms of growth for US and Europe. China's growth numbers have been less than robust in recent spurt of economic data, signaling further uncertainty in global economic landscape. Additionally, China is still executing policies to cool is overvalued property market to avert a property bubble. Therefore, central banks globally would be more in tune to keep rates low but not ruling out the possibility of rate cuts in the event that growth is drastically slowing down in the respective Asian economies. Even in the recent MPC meeting in Malaysia, policy makers are hinting that they will act if external developments results in a drag in domestic economic growth. Therefore, we have maintained the notion of buying into dips of MGS or PDS, as we believe the longer term trend is still patchy domestic economic growth and earnings visibility of companies remained relatively poor.
