EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

For the month of October 2017, the FBMKLCI fell 7.6 points or 0.4% m-o-m to close at 1,747. The weaker market was due to outflow of foreign funds of around RM226.3mil during the month. The broader market outperformed the FBMKLCI, with the FBM EMAS gaining 0.5% mom to 12,597pts for the month. Average daily value traded on Bursa in Oct fell 3% m-o-m to RM2.47bn.

October was a tough month for local bond market as Malaysian Government bond prices tumbles across the curve, tracking the higher US Treasury yields. This also resulted in strengthening the Dollar against major currencies, which has seen Ringgit weakened against the Dollar to RM4.23/USD from RM4.22/USD. Brent crude oil price inched higher to US\$61.37/bbl from US\$57.54/bbl due to the extension of output cuts led by OPEC.

Headline inflation in September rose to 4.3% YoY (Aug'17: 3.7% YoY), due to increase in transportation cost (fuel), though core inflation still remains stable at 2.4% YoY in September.

Going forward, we are cautiously positive on the equity market backed by better economic outlook, improving earnings, strengthening of the ringgit and potential election this year. However, short term foreign selling on the market may provide opportunity to accumulate on weakness. For fixed income, we are cautious in taking duration in view of an upward trending yield environment. Despite the local bond market is fuelled by the external risk factors such as geopolitical tension in North Korea, Brexit and fluctuation in crude oil prices, we believe corporate bond space still provides attractive yields given stable monetary stance from BNM and strong fundamentals in local market. As such, we will keep looking to buy on dips of corporate bonds if the opportunity arises.

Based on the performance table below, on monthly basis, Balanced Fund, Dividend Fund, Equity Fund and Income Fund had outperformed their respective benchmarks. Meanwhile other funds had underperformed their benchmarks.

Investment Objective

To achieve steady income stream with potential growth in the Asia Pacific Region over medium to long term. The aim of the Fund is to outperform the S&P Ethical Pan Asia Select Dividend Opportunities Index over periods of five or more years.

Investment Strategy

To invest in Asia Pacific Ethical Dividend Exchange Traded Fund (ETF), managed by CIMB Principal Asset Management where the ETF is listed on the Singapore Stock Exchange.

The ETF focuses on top 40 ethical and high yielding stocks in the Asia Pacific Region excluding India, Taiwan, Japan, New Zealand and Philippines. The fund provides country diversification across the industry that is traded in US Dollar.














Equity Market Review and Outlook

Market Review

For the month of October 2017, the FBMKLCI fell 7.6 points or 0.4% m-o-m to close at 1,747. The weaker market was due to outflow of foreign funds of around RM226.3mil during the month. The broader market outperformed the FBMKLCI, with the FBM EMAS gaining 0.5% mom to 12,597pts for the month. Average daily value traded on Bursa in Oct fell 3% m-o-m to RM2.47bn.

On the domestic economic front, Malaysia's industrial activities eased in September, as the Industrial Production Index (IPI) slowed to 4.7% y-o-y in September, from +6.8% in August. The slowdown was broad-based due partly to a shorter working month amid more public holidays in September. Given the strong industrial, services and external activities, Malaysia's real GDP may record a stronger growth in 3Q17, from +5.8% in 2Q.

Globally, the IMF expects global GDP to expand 3.6% in 2017 and 3.7% in 2018, up from prior estimates for 3.5% this year and 3.6% for 2018, driven by a pickup in trade, investment, and consumer confidence. Likewise, growth forecast in the US was raised to 2.2% for 2017 and 2.3% for 2018, from earlier projections of 2.1% in both periods. The IMF also raised its forecast for China's growth to 6.8% this year and 6.5% next year, from 6.7% and 6.4% prior.



Market Outlook & Strategy

Technically, the Head & Shoulders (H&S) pattern continues to take shape for the long term view. This multi-year reversal pattern would only be confirmed on a break below the neckline which is roughly about the 1,680 levels. In October, the index has breached below the neckline of its rectangle pattern or an irregular double top following the move below the 1,750 mark. The next support is at 1,729 followed by the double top measurement target of 1,705.

November has historically been a negative month for the FBMKLCI. We believe the market could be in store for some pullback or consolidation before the typical run-up and window dressing activities in December. Also, November is also a major results season for 3Q17 and there could be some disappointments in the market. This should provide opportunity to accumulate on weakness.

Going forward, we are cautiously positive on the equity market backed by better economic outlook, improving earnings, strengthening of the ringgit and potential election this year. We'll maintain the equity position at the slight high end of the range.

Fixed Income Review and Outlook

Market Review

October was a tough month for local bond market as Malaysian Government bond prices tumbles across the curve, tracking the higher US Treasury yields. This also resulted in strengthening the Dollar against major currencies, which has seen Ringgit weakened against the Dollar to RM4.23/USD from RM4.22/USD. Brent crude oil price inched higher to US\$61.37/bbl from US\$57.54/bbl due to the extension of output cuts led by OPEC.


On local economic data, headline inflation in September rose to 4.3% YoY (Aug'17: 3.7% YoY), due to increase in transportation cost (fuel), though core inflation still remains stable at 2.4% YoY in September. Trade surplus widened to RM9.9 billion in August, thanks to the strong double digit growth in both total export (+21.5% YoY) and import (+22.6% YoY). Malaysia foreign reserve continues to grow steadily, with the latest figure at US\$101.4 billion. The reserve is sufficient to retain 7.5 months of imports and 1.1 time short term external debts.

In Eurozone, the European Central Bank decided to cut its QE stimulus program by half to EU\$30 billion a month from January and expected to end in September 2018.

10-year US Treasury yield tumbled to a low of 2.46% from 2.33% before stabilizing back at 2.38%, taking cue from a potentially more hawkish Federal Reserve due to the new chairman appointment as well as US tax cut expectation before year-end. In addition, some higher-than-expected economic data on new home sales and produced goods has also been supportive for the high Treasury yields.

Market Outlook & Strategy

With major central banks showing signal towards tightening policy, we are cautious in taking duration in view of an upward trending yield environment. Despite the local bond market is fuelled by the external risk factors such as geopolitical tension in North Korea, Brexit and fluctuation in crude oil prices, we believe corporate bond space still provides attractive yields given stable monetary stance from BNM and strong fundamentals in local market. As such, we will keep looking to buy on dips of corporate bonds if the opportunity arises.
